

EXPANDED HISTORICRYE TROLLEY TOURS



BOOK REVIEW

Sprays of Salt: Reminiscences of a Native Shoaler is a collection of stories about growing up on the Isles of Shoals in the late 19th century. Chapters cover cod-fishing, swordfishing, lobstering, childhood stories of steamers, grand hotels and watching nature. Written in 1944, the book has been updated by descendants of the author, John W. Downs, with previously unpublished photos and other family memorabilia.

John Downs' recollections of the town of Gosport when it was a thriving community and his experiences as a fisherman offer rare glimpses of what life on the small island was like. He paints a vivid picture of the scenes and characters one might have encountered there.

The chapters are by topic and highly readable. There is a bit of genealogy dealing with Caswell, Downs, Spinney, Odiorne and Foss, all prominent names from the early days of Rye and Portsmouth. If you want to learn more about life on the Isles of Shoals "back when," this book is for you. Copies can be found in the Rye Town Museum gift shop.

THIS MONTH IN RYE HISTORY

The Great Gale of 1851


April, 1851: A severe northeast gale and the highest tides ever known in Rye caused great damage to the beaches and the coast. Little Harbor bridge was carried away. Two vessels were wrecked: the schooner *Boutwell* came ashore at Ragged Neck, the British *Crown* on Jenness Ledge.

A mast from the *Boutwell* was recycled as Rye's liberty pole, erected when Franklin Pierce was nominated for the presidency. The liberty pole stood on the common at Rye Center until 1874, when the wind blew it down.
