Unwanted Out West, Welcome in Rye!




David Thompson Gets His Land Grant

David Thompson, the son of a Scot, served as agent for the Council for New England, a joint-stock company launched in 1620 by Sir Ferdinando Gorges. King James gave the Council authority to dole out settlement rights, and in November, 1622 Thompson received a grant covering 6,000 acres, plus an island. With the land grant in hand, he could obtain the backing of Plymouth merchants for the fishing-and-fur-trading venture he hoped to establish in what is now Rye.

The native inhabitants of the land, their numbers depleted by a smallpox plague, were not a party to the grant.
